If you stay three days you have multiple options for exploring the Salzburg region and its stunning surrounding area.





After breakfast, take the lift up to Mönchsberg, where you can visit the Museum of Modern Art Salzburg and enjoy the exceptional panorama of Salzburg. A short walk further on from the Richterhöhe, you will find Hohensalzburg Fortress, the city's famous landmark. Interested in history?

Don't miss out ona guided tour!

Head back down to the old town, either via the fortress funicular or on foot along Festungsgasse. Festungsgasse leads you into Kapitelplatz, where you will see a modern work of art – Sphaera (a man on a golden ball).



Head through Domplatz with its magnificent cathedral to Residenz-platz and the famous Residenzbrunnen fountain. If you arrive at the right time, you might just get to hear the Salzburg Glockenspiel – Carillon, which is located

in the New Residence. After a short visit to St. Michael's Church, Salzburg's oldest parish church, you can head over to Mozartplatz, where you can marvel at the statue that it is dedicated to the city's most famous son, after whom the square is named.

Continue your walk on to DomQuartier Salzburg, an imposing baroque museum complex which opened its doors in 2014. Here you have the chance to experience an extraordinary museum tour, where stories of power, art history and architecture are presented in a unique interplay. Starting in the residence, you can wander through the state rooms, the Residence Gallery, the Cathedral Museum and the Museum of St. Peter. Equally impressive is the Rossacher Collection of the Salzburg Baroque Museum in the North Oratory. In addition, the new museum tour offers new, imposing views over the city of Salzburg and the surrounding mountains.



A stroll along the historic Getreidegasse with its many passages is an utterly must. This is also where you will find Mozart's birthplace. From here, continue on to the Siegmundstor and then to Herbert von Karajan square with the impressive Pferdeschwemme horse well. Just round the corner you will find the Festspielhaus, the Felsenreitschule theatre and the Haus für Mozart.

For dinner we recommend regional cuisine – just scan the QR code on the right and choose one of our favorite restaurants. night owls are spoilt for choice: the area surrounding the busy Anton Neumayer Platz is home to several hip bars and clubs where you can dance the night away.

A few more ideas for your first day in Salzburg: Definitly worth a look are for example the Petersfriedhof cemetery, St. Peters Abbey (there's aquaint little restaurant in the cellar here!) and the Franciscan Church.



DAY 2 EXPLORING THE NEW TOWN & TRI

After the famous old town, today's agenda is a journey of discovery through the new town: just 5 minutes away from the hotel you will find yourself at the Kongresshaus (also known as Salzburg Congress). Here you can also visit Mirabell Palace with its enchanting garden as well as the Dwarf Garden and the Baroque Museum.



Carry on through Dreifaltigkeitsgasse to the Dreifaltigkeitskirche (Holy Trinity Church).

The Mozart residence (Tanzmeisterhaus) is also just round the corner. From here it's just a gentle stroll along Linzergasse to the Sebastianskirche. The Sebastiansfriedhof cemetery is also worth a visit – it is the final resting place of Mozart's widow and his father Leopold. If you're hungry, we recommend to stop off at the 10 Fidelen Affen restaurant. From the medieval Steingasse it's quite a climb up to the Kapuzinerberg, which is rewarded with a great view over Salzburg. Beside that there is also a path leading directly to the Kapuzinerkloster (Capuchin monastery).

You get a very special impression of the city from the Salzach: from April to October, you can explore Salzburg by water on the "Amadeus" cruise boat. The "Amadeus" will take you to Hellbrunn, where you



can marvel at the famous palace and its magnificent gardens. Don't miss the trick fountains, the famous gazebo from "The Sound of Music", or the stone theatre. In July and August, you can also return to the centre by boat; otherwise, take bus route 25.

### ORIGINAL SOUND OF MUSIC TOUR

The live Sound of Music Tour guided tour chauffeurs you to the original film locations in and around Salzburg and shows you where The Sound of Music was filmed.



The tour starts at Mirabell
Gardens and carries on to
Leopoldskron Palace, Hellbrunn
Palace and Nonnberg Abbey.
From here the tour takes you

further into the Salzburg Lake District to St. Gilgen, and finally to Mondsee, where you can visit the famous church where Maria and the baron got married.

### HALLSTATT TOUR

This tour takes you directly from Salzburg to Hallstatt. During the journey of around 1 1/2 hours, you will pass several well-known bathing resorts such as Fuschl, St. Gilgen and Strobl. Once in Hallstatt, you have 2 hours to explore the romantic setting of Lake Hallstatt. The return journey takes you via Gosau, Russbach and Abtenau.



#### SALZBURG SALT MINE TOUR

This tour takes you along the banks of the Königsseeache via the Alpenstraße and up to Obersalzberg, where the leaders of the Third Reich resided once. The journey then continues to the highlight of the tour – the 490-year old salt mine in Berchtesgaden. Here, you put on the miners' original protective clothing and travel down into the mountain interior by a mine train. After the 1 1/2 hour tour, you are free to explore Berchtesgaden on your own and sample a couple of Bavarian specialities.

## TOUR OF THE KEHLSTEINHAUS OR EAGLE'S NEST

The Eagle's Nest tour departs from Mirabellplatz and takes you via the Alpenstraße to Obersalzberg in neighbouring Bavaria. From here, specially equipped buses will transfer you along a 6.5 km narrow road with a gradient of 22% to the top. The access road to the Eagle's Nest is a masterpiece, blown out of the solid mountain rock in just 13 months. At the top of the road, a magnificent lift takes you up the last 124 metres to the top. The plateau outside the Eagle's Nest offers imposing panoramic views over the entire Alpine region.

# THE WORLD FAMOUS BOSNA!

The Bosna, a tasty and hearty snack, is certainly not to be missed when visiting Salzburg. The best Bosna can be found at the place of origin, the Balkan Grill, a small stand in one of the famous passageways between Getreidegasse and university square.





# Mönchsberg underground & surfing on the wave!

The Almkanal is the oldest central european water supply system. It supplies our city with fresh water directly from the Alps. Every year in September, the Salzburger Almkanal is dry-laid and cleaned to the traditional "Almabkehr". Then you have the opportunity to walk through the mysterious underground under the Salzburger Mönchsberg and go on treasure hunts. The whole year we can surf on the Almwelle in the south of Salzburg. An artificial threshold creates a big wave, so it is possible to surf in the middle of the city.

Salzburg in just one day? No problem! Here are the main attractions of the city, which you can easily manage in one day.

DAY 1 HIGHLIGHTS OF THE OLD TOWN

From the hotel, start by walking along the banks of the Salzach (stop at Müllnersteg for one of the best photo spots in the whole city, with great views of the old town) until you reach Mirabell Palace and the beautiful Mirabell Gardens. After a quick visit to Mozart's house, cross the Salzach via Makartsteg, and take the lift next to the "Haus der Natur" museum up to the Mönchsberg. From here you have a great view over the whole city. Then it's back down to the Pferdeschwemme horse well, along Hofstallgasse and past the world-famous Festspielhaus, which encompasses the Haus für Mozart and the Felsenreitschule theatre, until you reach the Franciscan Church, Domplatz and Kapitelplatz. This spot can be



discribed as the heart of Salzburg.


Now we are on the way up to Hohensalzburg Fortress, the city's famous landmark. After visiting the fortress, it's back to the old town. On the way back down you will pass many sights, such as Residenzplatz, and Mozartplatz with its mighty statue of Mozart. Head along Judengasse to the bustling Getreidegasse, where you will find Mozart's birthplace and countless passageways.

This route is also peppered with many culinary highlights: if you like it spicy, stopping off at the "Balkan Grill" bosna stand is a must (this is where the bosna was invented!). If you have more of a sweet tooth, head to the famous Café Tomaselli or Konditorei Fürst (this is where the Mozartkugel was invented) on Alter Markt and recharge your batteries with home-made cakes and tarts.

Next, head back to the Salzach and climb on board the "Amadeus" for a cruise towards Hellbrunn Palace. This magnificent estate is home to various filming locations from "The Sound of Music", the world-famous musical. In summer the park that surrounds the castle turns into a beautiful sea of flowers. Don't miss the gazebo from the film, the trick fountains, and the impressive stone theatre. In the late afternoon, take the boat back to the old town.
